Proposed Amendments to Bylaws Article III. Officers

At Large Board Member amendment

• Moved by Betsey Wolfson, seconded by Barbara Farrell, and passed unanimously.

Staggered & Extended Terms amendment

Moved by Betsey Wolfson, seconded by Denise LeDuc, and passed unanimously.

Article III of our bylaws now reads as follows (amended language highlighted in yellow):

1. Officers

The Officers are President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Board Member At Large. An individual who wishes to become an officer should understand and adhere to NMQG's purpose and must have been an active member for one full year. Officers should attend 80% of the general meetings and meetings of the Officers, and they must, and they must fulfill the duties as described below in Duties of Officers.

4. Election of Officers

At the December meeting, new Officers will be elected to a two-year term, January through December, by a majority of the members present. Terms will be staggered as follows:

- Odd years: President. Treasurer, and Board Member at Large
- Even years: Vice President and Secretary

Candidates for President, Treasurer, and Board Member at Large are needed for the December 2021 election! Please let us know if you are interested.

Barbara Farrell is willing to train the new Treasurer, and to stay on as Co-Treasurer if necessary.

Exploring Free Motion Quilting - Sandy Wright

Free Motion Quilting (FMQ) on a Domestic Machine Resources — offered to NMQG by Sandy Wright June 2021



- 1. Teachers with books, websites and countless YouTube videos (Google is your friend)
 - a. More formal; maybe uses templates; plans out designs:
 - i. Cindy Needham
 - ii. Lisa Calle

 - iv. Judy Madsen (hybrid –planful and pre-marked using less formal designs!)
 - b. More informal; less marking, more "all over" designs, more free form

- 2. All about batting Your favorite batting company probably has good online resources. I am partial to Quilters' Dream batting. You can download their descriptive materials: https://drive.google.com/file/d/0B5IQYaFAMueAVUE0QUE4TUt2STA/view You can also request samples of their battings.
- 3. Basting tips:
 - a. Spray basting from Patsy Thompson: https://www.youtube.com/watch?
 v=2UoUzK19Vww&t=35s
 - b. Pin basting tips from Cindy Needham's class on Craftsy: https://www.craftsy.com/class/design-it-quilt-it-free-form-techniques/
 Cross two toothpicks and tape to the center of your basting surface as an aid to
- 4. Needles: everyone has their favorites! I like <u>Schmetz</u> topstitch needles -either 80/12 or 90/14. They are sharper, have a larger eye and a deeper groove for the thread to move along (so also great for thicker threads).
 - Do replace your needle often. It is really the part of your sewing computer making the stitch!
- 5. Thread: Use a good quality thread:

centering your quilt back

- a. "Long staple" means longer fibers -which means less stretch and a stronger thread.
- b. Thread is identified by a two-number system. The first number (e.g. "50") is the thickness of the thread, the lower the number, the *thicker* the thread. The second number (e.g., 3) is the number of plies twisted together.
- Sometimes you just need to switch your thread. Black thread is over dyed and sometimes is weaker. You can sometimes revive older thread by remoisturizing!
 --take it in the bathroom during a steamy shower, or put it in the freezer in a baggy and let it thaw.

- 6. Set up:
 - a. "Machingers" are my favorite quilting gloves.
 - b. "Supreme Slider" or a little Turtle Wax can make it easier to move your quilt. (Not as important as controlling drag/weight or using gloves).
 - c. You may like Quilt suspension systems (<u>see Carol Breyer- Fallert</u>). I have the one sold by <u>Patsy Thompson</u>. I feel like this should be more useful than it is. I find I have to readjust clamps too often as I move around the quilt. - Designs & motifs: --Check the Modern Quilt Guild website and YouTube first for lots of free instruction. Also, if you have a membership to "thequiltshow.com" they have lots of segments on FMQ

 - ii. Patsy Thompson -Patsy seems to have made some of her DVD's free downloads https://www.patsythompsondesigns.com/free-video-tutrorials.htm. I have learned so much from her –just watching her movements and pacing. Don't let the music and initial presentation turn you off.
 - THICK THREADS —Patsy's class on Craftsy "Ultimate Free-motion Quilting has a whole section on what she calls: "Hyper-Quilting". —Bottom line -use a large topstitch needle and try it!
