#### **PROGRAM**

Timna Tarr interviewed <u>Scott Fortunoff</u>, president and owner of the <u>Jaftex group of fabric companies</u>, including Studio E, which produced Timna's "Noble Menagerie" fabric line.

Scott discussed the current Covid-related crisis in the fabric industry and urged us to follow him on Facebook and Instagram where he has made it his mission to share as much as he can of the inner workings of fabric production. He particularly recommended the Facebook video of his tour of Kaffe Fassett's home and studio, April 25, 2018.

Throughout his enthusiastic presentation Scott took all our questions, and surprised us at the end by giving away fabric bundles to lucky winners Betsey Wolfson and Donna Thibault-Wong.
