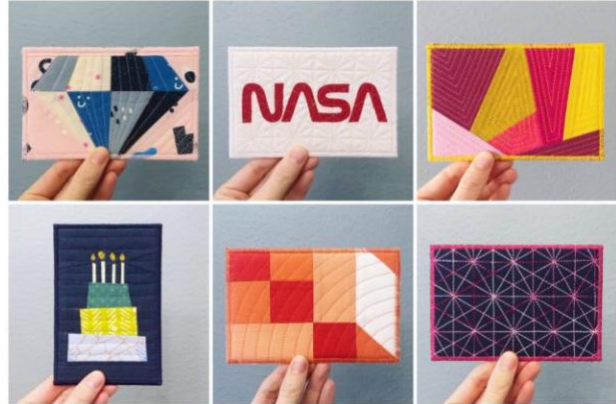


Fabric Postcard Challenge – Summer 2020

Here's how to participate:



- **ASAP (by 7/13?) email Betty MacLeod at MacLeod5@aol.com** and include your mailing address so she can pair you up with someone else participating in the swap.
- **Create a 4"x 6" quilted fabric postcard.** You'll find lots of tutorials online including:

- **Use materials you have on hand.**
 - No need to spend money.
 - Challenge your resourcefulness!
- **Try a new technique!** Not necessary, but a great opportunity.
- **Mail the postcard to your partner by Saturday, September 5th** so recipients can share them during our Zoom meeting on Sunday, September 13th (one weekend later than usual because of the Labor Day weekend).
 - Mail it by itself:
 - Make sure it's a bit flexible (like a regular postcard) for USPS sorting machines.
 - Take it to the post office where you will need to pay extra postage for hand canceling.
 - Or mail it in an envelope – **essential** if you add beads, buttons, etc.
