# **PROGRAM**

## **UFO Challenge**

Seventeen of us participated in the challenge and offered brief comments as we viewed the "before" and "after" photos of the UFOs we managed to complete.

Betty MacLeod officiated at the on-camera drawings for gift certificates to the local fabric store of the winner's choice. The winners are:

Betty also passed along some tips for working on UFOs:

- Quilt Project Tracker from allpeoplequilt.com, which can remind you what your next step was to be when you pick that project up again.
- Ask yourself why you are not finishing: is the quilting or binding giving you trouble? Once you
  identify the problem you can make plans to become more proficient or hire someone to complete
  the task that has become your stumbling block.
- Make a list of the UFOs. Just making a list can help you move along.
- Feel that it's OK to pass along (or cut up to use in another project) a UFO that is no longer sparking any joy for you.

# AMAZING ABSTRACTS with Julia Graves

March 13 and March 20, 2021 (two Saturdays) / 1:00-3:30 р.м. EST

CLASS DESCRIPTION: Create an abstract quilt that has amazing movement and drama, using



the techniques pioneered by Ursula Kern\*. Go from inspiration to a simple sketch, then have fun "coloring" your sketch with bits of fabric to create a mock-up of your design – see before you sew! The design is gridded, and blocks are foundation pieced using an easy sew-and-flip method, with room for creativity and improvisation. Lots of discussion of design principles and how to use color and value to create the drama and desired effects. A supply list will be supplied before the workshop.

**FEE:** \$30-40 per person. 20 person max. If you wish to contribute to the NMQG scholarship fund, donations are welcome.

Julia Graves started her quilting business, Special Occasion Quilts LLC, in 2007 and teaches, lectures, designs patterns, makes commission quilts, longarms for others, and sells and services APQS longarm machines. Graves won Best Longarm Machine Workmanship Wall Quilt Category at the 2016 Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival; is a Gem Affiliate teaching the gorgeous gem patterns by MJ Kinman – Textile Artist; has had her quilts published in books by Gloria Loughman, Katie Pasquini-Masupust, and MJ Kinman; was an Artist-in-Residence at Empty Spools in 2019; and will be teaching at Empty Spools in 2021 and 2022.
